Policies on Public Exhibition

The following draft policy is currently on public exhibition for a period of 28 days:

- Restricted Assets (Internal) Policy.

Copies of the draft policy may be viewed at Council's Administration Building during business hours or viewed on Council's website www.narrabri.nsw.gov.au.

Submissions will be received up to 5.00pm on Tuesday 28 June 2016. If the submission is by way of an objection, the objection must be clearly stated. Subject to no submissions being received, the Restricted Assets (Internal) Policy will come into effect from 1 July 2016.

New Lights for Hogan Oval

Narrabri Touch Football heard exciting news last week that they would receive \$25,000 through NSW Sport and Recreation towards upgrading the Hogan Oval Lights. Council committed \$35,000 this financial year toward this project which was used as leverage to win the grant.

Hogan Oval is used by Touch Football, Senior Soccer, Junior Rugby League, School sport and Cricket in the summer months. The funding will allow the field lighting to be upgraded to meet relevant Australian Standards for training at night.

Fair Work Campaign in Narrabri Area

The Fair Work Ombudsman (FWO) is currently conducting an education and compliance campaign in the Narrabri and Moree Region.

During the campaign, Fair Work inspectors will contact randomly selected businesses to monitor compliance with the record-keeping, pay slip and wages obligations of Australia's workplace laws. Fair Work inspectors will promote the tools and resources available from the FWO to help employers meet compliance.

If a Fair Work inspector contacts you during the campaign, you can expect:

- An overview of the campaign and how it relates to your business.
- Information and resources to help your business comply with its workplace obligations.
- A request for a sample of employee time and wage records.

If a Fair Work inspector finds any errors, they will help you rectify these and ensure that you have the right information to help you remain compliant in the future.
